(2)	B	you're — Contraction of "you are", acting as the subject and auxiliary verb for the continuous action "doing".
(3)	C	yours — Possessive pronoun used here to replace a possessive adjective + noun combination ("your pen").
(4)	D	you're — Contraction of "you are", serving as the subject and helping verb for the progressive continuous phrase "planning to".
(5)	C	your — Possessive adjective indicating ownership of the singular noun "spelling assignment".
(6)	C	you're — Contraction of "you are", required here ahead of the future-facing phrase "going to".
(7)	B	your — Possessive adjective modifying the singular abstract noun "work".
(8)	B	you're — Contraction of "you are", paired with the past participle adjective "finished" to indicate status.
(9)	C	their — Distractor check. Requires third-person plural possessive "their" to match "The little children".
(10)	D	you're — Contraction of "you are", functioning as the subject and linking verb before the predicate adjective "ready".
